The impact of your generosity

Patient care



Your support helps frontline staff deliver compassionate care when it matters most. From funding the first e-bike for the cycle response unit, to supplying specialist equipment, and even tiny hats for premature babies, your generosity enhances patient care across the east of England.

Thanks to the incredible fundraising efforts of the Wells-next-the-Sea community, which raised over **£6,000**, the charity was able to fund the first ever e-bike for the EEAST cycle response unit. This has made a significant impact on both the team and the patients they serve - transforming how the team reaches patients quickly and efficiently.

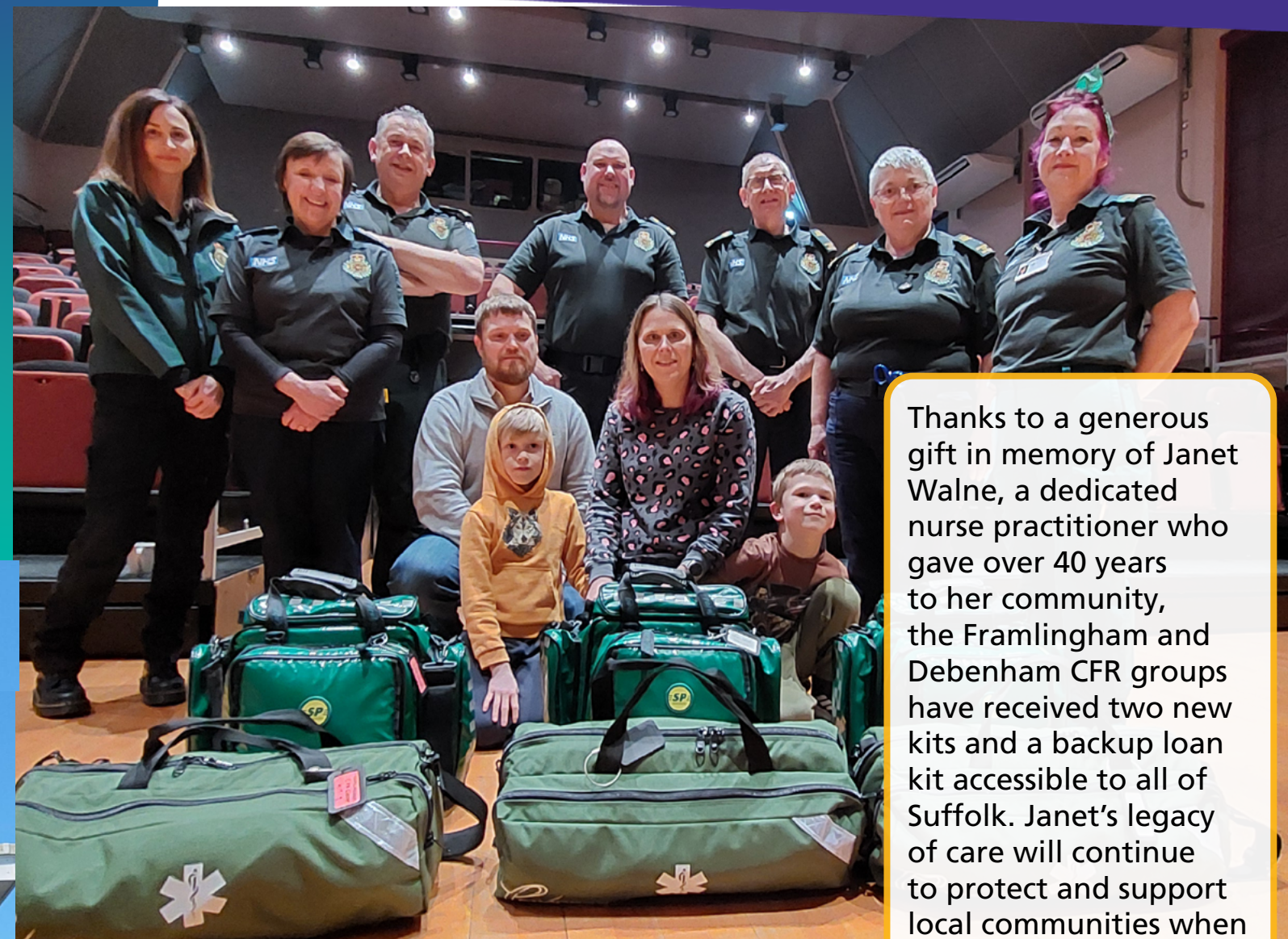

Supporting communities



EEAST Heart is a free community-based education programme in basic life support & defibrillator awareness for the members of the public run by East of England Ambulance Service NHS Trust qualified volunteers & staff. Funded solely from the generosity of donors, many of whom have attended the awareness sessions themselves. All donations received, are reinvested into the project to provide training aids, certificates, promotional materials and other equipment to support sessions.

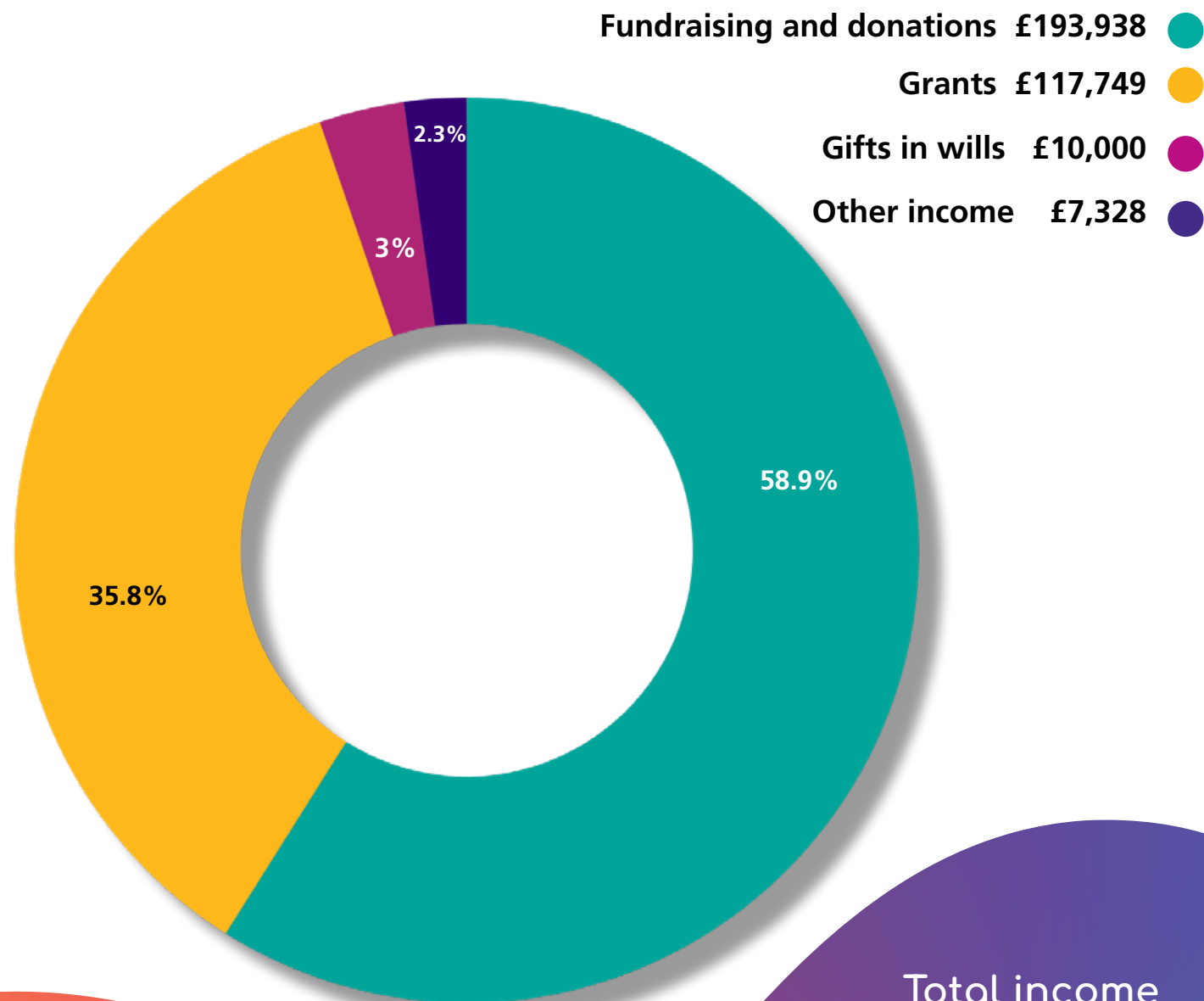

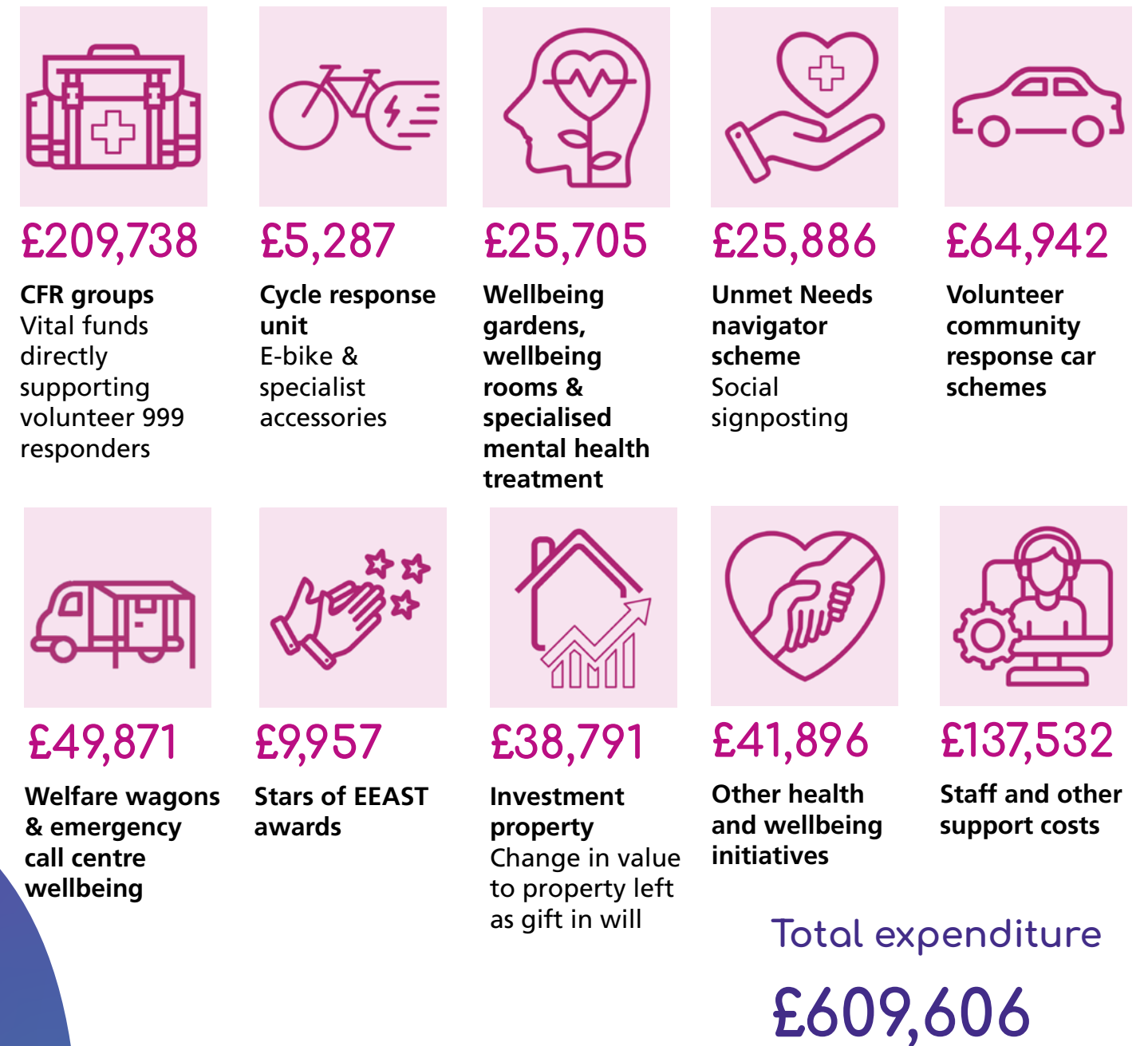
Income vs Expenditure
